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Dr. Alyssa Robillard is an associate professor at Arizona State University at the Edson College of Nursing and Health Innovation. Her work is motivated by health equity and informed by the socioecological view of health that acknowledges the role of environmental as well as individual factors associated with health problems—and the multiple levels through which problems can be addressed. As a trained health education specialist, her research examines novel strategies to promote behavioral and biomedical HIV prevention in women using community engagement as a foundation. She studies the role of narratives in interventions to prevent HIV and improve quality of life in people living with HIV. Dr. Robillard received her post-secondary training from Xavier University of Louisiana and the University of Alabama at Birmingham, School of Public Health in health education and health promotion.
